

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# INTRODUCTION

The land area of Ethiopia is estimated at about 1.1 million square kilometers and the current population is approximately 71.1 million, of which more than 84.2 percent live in rural areas. Ethiopia is a Federal Democratic Republic composed of 9 National Regional States (NRS): Tigray, Afar, Amhara, Oromia, Somalia, Benishangul-Gumuz, Southern Nations, Nationalities and Peoples Region (SNNPR), Gambella and Harari, and two Administrative states (Addis Ababa city administration and Dire Dawa council)

The National Regional States as well as the two city administrative councils are further divided into five hundred eighty woredas and to around 15,000 kebeles (5,000 urban & 10,000 rural).

An estimated 60 to 80 percent of health problems are due to infectious and communicable diseases and nutritional problems. The public health care system is underdeveloped and only able to provide basic service to about 64% of the population. Much of the rural population has little access to modern health care, that lead to the inability of the health care delivery systems to respond both quantitatively and qualitatively to the health needs of the people. Previously, the health delivery system was highly centralized; delivered in a fragmented way and relied on vertical programs; and there was little collaboration between the public and private sectors. Consequently, the Ethiopian Transitional and Federal Governments have initiated political, economic and social changes resulting in the formulation of the 1985 Health Policy and Strategy. The Federal Government and the regional authorities through the health service extension program (HSEP) are trying to reorganize health services into a more cost-effective and efficient system better able to meet the needs of its citizens and contribute to the overall socio-economic development effort of the country.

The Government Health Sector Development plan is to realize its health development objective through a twenty-year health sector development strategy, with a five-year rolling investment programs, with first Health Sector Development Program (HSDPI) covering periods 1990 - 1994. This has been followed by the second HSDP covering 1995-1997.

Both HSDPI & II are intimately linked to PRSP of the country, & like the National Health Policy, are the result of a critical examination of the nature, magnitude and root causes of the prevailing health problems of the country and awareness of newly emerging health problems. Founded on a commitment to democratic principles and to decentralized management and provision of service, it accords appropriate emphasis to the needs of the less privileged rural population which constitute the overwhelming majority of the population and it also sets realistic goals and the means for attaining them. In so doing, the Government accords health a prominent place in its order of priorities and commits itself to the attainment of these goals accessing through the proper utilization of both internal and external resources.

The Federal Ministry of Health has planned to develop health specific software package to facilitate & get more reliable information from all regions after taking critical assessment & standardization of the reporting format at all levels. In the last two years special emphasis was also given to incorporate the service provided by private health institutions.

It is to be noted that some of the incomplete data from few regions may have underestimated the Health Service Utilization Rate of the country. In this particular publication it stands at 0.36 visit per person per year. The contraceptive prevalence rate from the private sector has only been reported from Addis Ababa city administration and needs further coverage and refinement of the report.













## **GLOSSARY**

### **Age Dependency Ratio**

The ratio of persons in the “dependent” ages (under 15 and older than 64 years) to those in the “economically productive” ages (15-64 years) in a population.

### **Antenatal Coverage**

A coverage to a health institution made by a pregnant woman to be sure that she has a safe pregnancy.

### **Average Household Size**

The mean number of members per household

### **Child Mortality**

The probability of dying between exact age one and the fifth birth day per 1000 children surviving to the first birth day.

### **Child Woman Ratio**

The number of children under age five per 1,000 women of childbearing age in a given year. This measure is used as a rough fertility indicator, especially when detailed data on births are lacking.

### **Contraceptive Prevalence Rate**

The proportion of eligible women (15-49 years old) who got contraceptive service.

### **Crude Birth Rate**

The number of births in a population during a specified period divided by the number of person-years-lived by the population during the same period. It is frequently expressed as births per 1,000 population.

### **Crude Death Rate**

The number of deaths in a population during a specified period divided by the number of person-years-lived by the population during the same period. It is frequently expressed as deaths per 1,000 population.

### **Delivery Attended**

The service given for a pregnant woman during labor; management of normal delivery and detection of complications, management of risk cases in labor and complicated cases.

## **Demography**

The study of population and its characteristics, with reference to such factors as size, age structure, density, fertility, mortality, growth and social and economic variables.

## **Discharged Patient**

The number of patients who are discharged from the health institution (whether it is dead or alive) after being diagnosed and/or treated.

## **Drug Shop**

Shall mean an establishment which offers for sale to the public. Such medical preparations, cosmetics nursing and sanitary articles, dietetic products and other articles as approved for the purpose by the Ministry but does not engage in the compounding preparation or manufacture of any medical preparation.

## **Enrolment Ratio**

The number of students attending a given school, divided by the total number of persons of the age normally in school at that level.

## **Fully Immunized**

A child of age under one who has taken all types of antigens completely.

## **General Fertility Rate**

The number of births occurring in a given year per 1000 women in the reproductive ages (i.e. women aged 15-49).

## **Health Center**

Establishment which provides both preventive and curative out-patient care. Health Centre is also responsible for training CHAs & TBAs.

## **Health Post**

One of the satellite facility in the Primary Health Care Unit

## **Health Stations**

The smallest health units in the conventional Health Service structure and are staffed with 1-3 health assistants.

## **Higher Clinic**

Staffed at least by a general medical practitioner, a specialist and assisted by various specialists serve for general outpatient clinics. For emergency

and delivery this clinic has up to 5 beds.

## Hospital

An establishment with at least 25 beds that provides general medical care round the clock. It is at least equipped with basic laboratory, X-ray and basic treatment facilities. It is staffed with at least one medical practitioner.

## Household

A single person living alone or a group voluntarily living together, having common house keeping arrangements for supplying basic living needs, such as principal meals. The group may consist of related or unrelated persons.

## Infant Mortality Rate

The ratio of the number of deaths under one year of age occurring in a given year to the number of births in the same year. Also used in a more rigorous sense to mean the number of deaths that would occur under one year of age in a life table with a radix of 1,000.

## Infant Mortality

The probability of dying between birth and age one per 1000 live births in a given year.

## In-Patient

A patient who is admitted and occupy bed in a health institution for diagnosis and/or treatment.

## Life Expectancy at Birth

The average number of years a newborn infant can expect to live under current mortality levels.

## Live Birth

The complete expulsion or extraction from its mother of conception, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy, which after such separation shows any evidence of life.

## Lower Clinic

Staffed at least by a health assistant or a nurse and serve for general outpatient clinic.

## **Maternal Mortality Rate**

A measure of a woman's risk of dying from causes associated with pregnancy.

## **Medium Clinic**

Staffed at least by health officer or general medical practitioner & serve for general medical services.

## **Morbidity**

The extent of illness, injury or disability in a population.

## **Out-Patient**

A patient who receive ambulatory care (examination and treatment) without being admitted or occupying a bed.

## **Pharmacy**

Any store, shop or other place in which medicinal preparation are compounded or prepared and dispensed or sold to the public.

## **Postnatal Visits**

Visits made by a mother to a HCU or visited by a health worker (at home) within the first 45 days after giving birth.

## **Potential Health Service Coverage**

The population covered in percentage based on the existing health centers and health stations in catchment's area.

## **Rate of National Increase**

The difference between the births and deaths occurring during a given period divided by the number person-year lived by the population during the same period. This rate, which specifically excludes changes resulting from migration, is equal to the difference between the crude birth rate and the crude death rate.

## **Rural Drug Vendor**

The lowest level of medicinal retail outlet that dispenses medical preparations as approved for this level by the Ministry, but does not engage in compounding preparation or manufacturing of any medical preparation.

## **School Enrolment**

The number of students who are enrolled and attend various educational institutions.

## **Sex Ratio**

The number of males in a population or specific sub-population, divided by corresponding number of females, conventionally multiplied by 100.

## **Special Clinic**

Provides specific medical interventions such as medical, surgical, obstetric gyn, ophthalmology, etc. and is assisted by specialists in various disciplines.

## **Total fertility Rate**

The average number of children that would be born per woman of all women lived to end of their childbearing years and born children according to a given set of age specific fertility rates.

## **Under-five Mortality**

The probability of dying between birth and age five per 1000 live births in a given year.

## **Under 5 Children**

Under 5 year children visits to health institution for monitoring of growth and development, screening of risk cases, and for management of disease or mal development.

## **Vital Events**

Births, deaths, marriages and divorces.

## **GNI PPP per Capita**

GNI PPP per capita is Gross National Income in purchasing power parity (PPP) divided by midyear population. GNI PPP refers to Gross National Income converted to “international” dollars using a purchasing power parity conversion factor. International dollars indicate the amount of goods & services one could buy in the United States with a given amount of money.
